- Do not aim the camera at the sun or extra bright places.
  Blooming or smearing may occur otherwise (which is not a malfunction), and affect the endurance of sensor at the same time.
- The sensor may be burned out by a laser beam, so when any laser equipment is in using, make sure that the surface of sensor will not be exposed to the laser beam.
- Do not place the camera in extremely hot, cold (the operating temperature shall be -30 °C to +60 °C), dusty or damp locations, and do not expose it to high electromagnetic radiation.
- To avoid heat accumulation, good ventilation is required for operating environment.
- Keep the camera away from liquid while in use.

- While in delivery, the camera shall be packed in its original packing, or packing of the same texture.
- Regular part replacement: a few parts (e.g. electrolytic capacitor) of the equipment shall be replaced regularly according to their average enduring time. The average time varies because of differences between operating environment and using history, so regular checking is recommended for all the users. Please contact with your dealer for more details.
- This equipment is not suitable for use in locations where children are likely to be present.




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# **1** Appearance Description

This series of cameras has three types with the same appearance and different cable connections. The overview of these types of cameras are shown below.












Figure 1-3 Cable Connection of Type II Camera




Figure 1-4 Cable Connection of Type III Camera




Figure 1-5 Cable Connection of Type IV Camera

#### Notes:

- Power on the camera when pressing the RESET button, and press button for another 10 seconds to restore the default settings, including the user name, password, IP address, port No., etc.
- Only type III and type IV cameras support audio and alarm functions.

 For cameras support power over Ethernet (PoE), the power is passed along with data on Ethernet cabling. And a switch that supports PoE function is required.

# 2 Installation

#### Before you start:

- Make sure the device in the package is in good condition and all the assembly parts are included.
- The standard power supply is 12 VDC or PoE. Make sure your power supply matches with your camera.
- Make sure all the related equipment is power-off during the installation.
- Check the specification of the products for the installation environment.
- Make sure that the wall is strong enough to withstand four times the weight of the camera and the bracket.

For the camera that supports IR, you are required to pay attention to the following precautions to prevent IR reflection:

- Dust or grease on the bubble will cause IR reflection. Do not remove the bubble film until the installation is finished. If there is dust or grease on the bubble, clean the bubble with clean soft cloth and isopropyl alcohol.
- Make sure that there is no reflective surface too close to the camera lens. The IR light from the camera may reflect back into the lens causing reflection.
- The foam ring around the lens must be seated flush against the inner surface of the bubble to isolate the lens from the IR LEDS.
   Fasten the bubble to camera body so that the foam ring and the bubble are attached seamlessly.

# 2.1 Install the Memory Card

This camera series supports memory card installation and the steps are similar.

### Steps:

1. Disassemble the camera to uninstall the adapter plate, bubble and black liner from the camera in order.




Figure 2-1 Disassemble the Camera

- Rotate the camera body to completely expose the memory card slot.
- 3. Insert the memory card into the memory card slot, and push to get it mounted.

4. (Optional) To unmount the memory card, push to eject it.

# 2.2 Camera Mounting

This camera series shares the similar installation steps, and we take type I camera as an example.

### Before you start:

Before the camera installation, disassemble the camera to uninstall the adapter plate, bubble and black liner from the camera in order.




Figure 2-3 Disassemble the Camera

### 2.2.1 Ceiling Mounting

#### Steps:

1. Install the adapter plate to the ceiling with the screws.




Figure 2-4 The Size of the Screw Holes




Figure 2-5 Install the Adapter Plate

- 2. Drill screw holes according to the adapter plate.
- (Optional) If you want to route the cables inside the ceiling, drill a cable hole in the ceiling according to the adapter plate.
- 4. Route and connect the cables.
- 5. Align the holes and secure the camera with the supplied screws.




Figure 2-6 Secure the Camera

6. Rotate the lens to adjust the surveillance angle.




Figure 2-7 Adjust the Angle

- Adjust the zoom and focus. Refer to Section 2.3 Adjust Zoom and Focus for the detailed information.
- 8. Install the inner black liner back to the camera.
- 9. Install the bubble back to the camera and secure it with screws.




Figure 2-8 Secure Black Liner and Bubble

# 2.2.2 Wall Mounting

### Before you start:

A wall mounting bracket is needed for the wall mounting and should be purchased separately. For the recommended models of the bracket, consult the technical support.

### Steps:

1. Route the cables, install the mounting bracket on the wall, and secure the cap on the bracket.




Figure 2-9 Install the Wall Mount Bracket

2. Install the adapter plate to the cap with screws.




Figure 2-10 The Size of the Screw Holes





Figure 2-11 Install the Adapter Plate

- 7. Secure the bubble to the camera with screws.




Figure 2-14 Secure Black Liner and Bubble

# 2.2.3 Pendant Mounting

# Before you start:

A pendant mounting bracket is needed for the pendant mounting and should be purchased separately. For the recommended models of the bracket, consult the technical support.

# Steps:

1. Route the cables, install the mounting bracket, and secure the cap on the bracket.




Figure 2-15 Install the Mount Bracket

2. Install the adapter plate to the cap with screws.





Figure 2-16 The Size of the Screw Holes

4. Rotate the lens to adjust the surveillance angle.




Figure 2-19 Adjust the Angle

# 2.3 Adjust Zoom and Focus

# 2.3.1 Manually Adjustment

Certain camera models have the lens that zoom and focus must be manually adjusted via zoom/focus lever. Use the zoom lever and focus lever to adjust the zoom and focus.

### Steps:

1. Loosen the zoom lever and move the lever between T (Tele) and W (Wide) to obtain the appropriate angle of view.

- 2. Tighten the zoom lever.
- Loosen the focus lever and move the lever between F (Far) and N (Near) to obtain the optimum focus.
- 4. Tighten the focus lever.

### 2.3.2 Motor-Driven Lens

Some camera models are equipped with a motor-driven lens. Adjust the zoom and focus on PTZ control panel by visiting the camera via web browser or client software.




Figure 2-22 Zoom and Focus Adjustment via Web Browser

# 2.4 Waterproof Measures

If the camera is installed outdoor, you should use the waterproof accessory or tapes to waterproof the cables. Otherwise, the cables might get wet or a short circuit occurs.

# 2.4.1 Install Network Cable Waterproof Jacket




Figure 2-23 Install Waterproof Jacket

### Steps:

- 1. Feed the network cable through 1 and 3 in order.
- 2. Fix (2) on the network cable between (1) and (3).
- 3. Place (5) onto the end of (6), and plug the RJ45 male connector into RJ45 female connector.
- 4. Screw (3) to (6) clockwise.
- 5. Push (2) into (3).
- 6. Secure (1) with the (3) in clockwise direction.

# 2.4.2 Waterproof Other Cables

After routing and connecting the cables, use the waterproof tapes to wrap up the cables. Connected cables and spare cables both should be wrapped up as the figures below.




Figure 2-24 Waterproof Cables
